

What is 5C, and why should you care?

5C will increase your property taxes permanently.

Streets in subdivisions in unincorporated Boulder County have not been maintained as well as they should have been. It will cost money to repair them.

5C will create a special tax jurisdiction.

You've been paying property taxes that should cover this work. The county is asking you to create a Public Improvement District (PID) that will tax you AGAIN to pay for the streets in your unincorporated subdivision.

That's what ballot issue 5C is about.

Vote NO on 5C

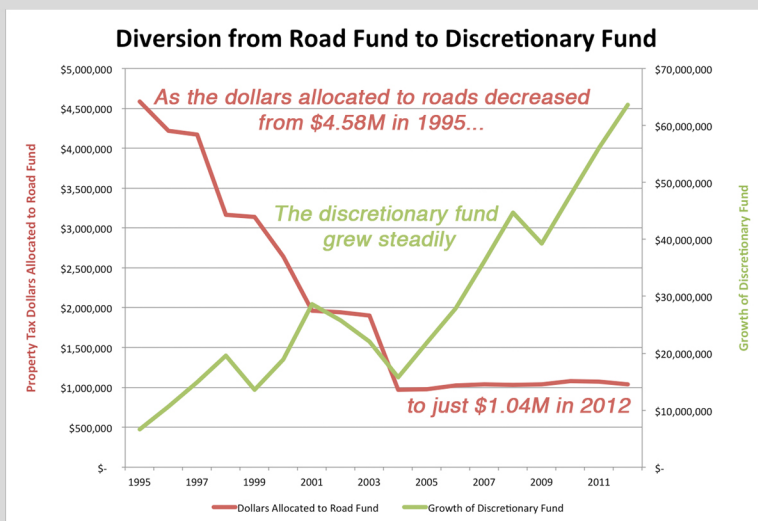

Boulder County is asking you to increase your property taxes FOREVER.



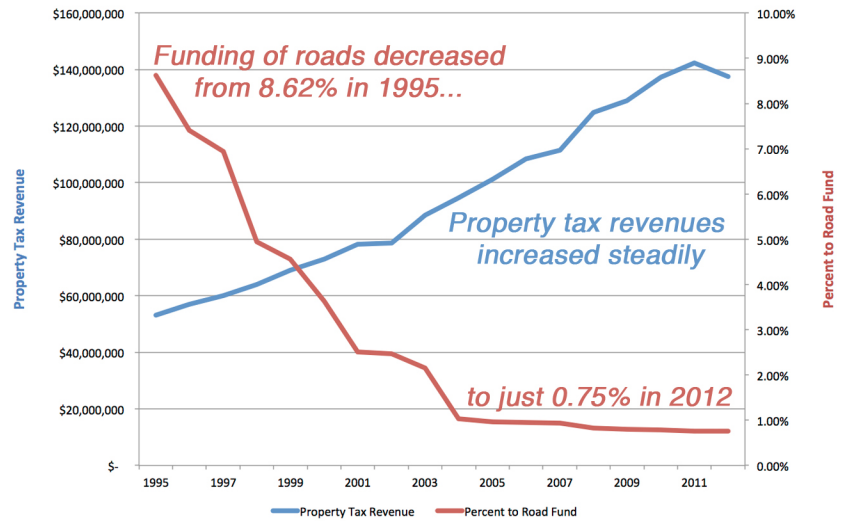
The County Commission had ample property tax revenues and chose not to allocate sufficient funds to properly maintain our streets.

The Commission diverted millions of dollars into a discretionary fund.

Today that discretionary fund has more than \$63 million - more than enough to repair our subdivision streets.

It is time to put those discretionary funds back to work to repair our roads - where they should have been all along.

Why are we in this predicament?



Property tax revenues in Boulder County have increased steadily since 1995. The county collected millions of dollars for our roads.

In 1995 the County Commission chose to divert revenue that had been allocated to the Road Fund in previous years.

As a result, our subdivision streets - which the county owns - have deteriorated and are in need of repairs.

5C asks you to pay again for their neglect. Tell them "NO".
